On Tuesday, the 29th January 2013, at 10 o'clock, in the Conference Hall of the International Telematic University UNINETTUNO, in Corso Vittorio Emanuele, 39 there will be the Conference of presentation of the results gained by the European Project CBVI - Cross Border Virtual Incubator, a project funded by the European Union in the framework of the Lifelong Learning Programme meant to promote entrepreneurship and incubation processes and the exchange of knowledge aimed at the economic development of the European regions involved.
