Rector Maria Amata Garito says that the launch of MOOCs is a direct consequence of what the Consorzio Nettuno and the International Telematic University Uninettuno have continued to do for 20 years with the digital satellite channel Rai Nettuno Sat where university courses and lectures are broadcast according to a weekly schedule and at night on RAI-2 (the second Italian public television channel).

"To offer this content on the Internet seemed natural considering that the mission of our university is the democratization of access to knowledge through new technologies", says Professor Garito. She also

notes that "students are free at any time to ask to be placed in classes coordinated by the tutor to fully utilize the distance learning educational model of UNINETTUNO and participate in interactive sessions and collaborative learning on our e-learning platform. This option has an estimated cost based on the number of hours of the course and the number of hours of study required will allow the student to be admitted to the exam in order to get the credits relating to the individual Module. We expect in the long run the possibility of being able to develop new services tailored to the specific needs of students as well as new lines of business best suited to the demands of a contemporary and flexible labor market.'
